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Horizon 2020 and the Withdrawal Agreement

The UK's eligibility to participate in the Green Deal call is part of the Withdrawal Agreement

- The Withdrawal Agreement, as agreed between the European Union and the United Kingdom, entered into force on 1 February 2020.
- **The WA means that the UK can continue to participate in EU programmes**, including Horizon 2020, that are financed by the 2014-2020 Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF) until their closure (i.e. **for the lifetime of grants**).

Horizon 2020 and the Withdrawal Agreement

- UK participants will continue to receive EU grant funding for the lifetime of individual Horizon 2020 projects, **including projects finishing after the transition period ends at the end of 2020.**
- UK scientists, researchers and businesses can continue to **participate in and lead** Horizon 2020 projects **and apply for Horizon 2020 grant funding.**
- The vast majority of Horizon 2020 projects will be able to continue as before during the transition period and beyond.

A very limited number of UK Horizon 2020 projects, which involve access to security-related sensitive information restricted for EU Member States, may be unable to continue after EU Exit in their current form. The government expects the Commission to inform participants if this is the case. Any affected UK grant holders should contact UKRI at EUGrantsFunding@ukri.org.

European Commission guidance

“The Withdrawal Agreement as agreed between the European Union and the United Kingdom entered into force on 1 February 2020.

In overall terms, on the basis of the Withdrawal Agreement, the UK-based legal entities will continue to be fully eligible to participate and receive funding in the current 2014-2020 EU programmes, including Horizon 2020, as if the UK were a member state until the closure of these programmes, unless security considerations apply.

This means that UK beneficiaries can continue – without interruption – to receive grants awarded under the current and previous MFFs until their end dates, even if these are after 2020.”

UKRO maintains this factsheet to provide the latest information on the current UK situation in relation to Horizon 2020 and other EU funding schemes. You are invited to disseminate this factsheet within your institutions and to your European and international partners.

UK participation in Horizon 2020

UK scientists, researchers and businesses can continue to participate in, bid for and lead projects in Horizon 2020, as if the UK remained a Member State, even after the UK exits the EU on 31 January 2020. The UK remains the second highest recipient of Horizon 2020 funding for science and innovation and UK organisations are encouraged to continue to bid into calls for grants until the end of the Horizon 2020 programme.

The **Withdrawal Agreement** means that the UK continues to participate in EU Programmes financed by the 2014-2020 Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF) until their closure. Horizon 2020 is a Programme funded under the current MFF. UK scientists, researchers and businesses can continue to participate in these programmes and receive EU grant funding for the lifetime of individual projects, including projects finishing after the transition period ends in 2020.

A very limited number of UK Horizon 2020 projects, which involve access to security-related sensitive information restricted for EU Member States, may be unable to continue after EU Exit in their current form. The government expects the European Commission to inform participants if this is the case. Any affected UK grant holders should contact UKRI at EUGrantsFunding@ukri.org

What does the European Commission say?

- **Eligibility of UK applicants** – The Commission included a standard notice in the **Introduction to the 2018-2020 Work Programme** of Horizon 2020 regarding the eligibility of UK organisations.
- **Evaluation** - The Commission provides a **briefing for evaluators**, which states the following: "... Experts should not evaluate proposals with UK participants any differently than before."
- **Addressing Brexit risks in applications** - The Commission also provides **guidance to coordinators** of Horizon 2020 proposals with regards to addressing the risks associated with Brexit in future proposals.

European Green Deal call

- The Green Deal call will mobilise research and innovation to foster a just and sustainable societal transition
- Projects are expected to deliver tangible and visible results relatively quickly and show how research and innovation can provide concrete solutions for the Green Deal main priorities
- Goal:
 - kick-start the environmental, social and economic transformations required to tackle the climate challenge
 - help the EU recover from the Covid-19 crisis & increase resilience
- *“The challenge is not just technical: it requires profound adaptations in life-styles and behaviour.”*
- experimentation, social innovation and citizen engagement

Ten call areas

- **Eight principal areas** reflect the structure of the European Green Deal
- **Two supporting areas** that cut across the eight core areas and offer a longer-term perspective in achieving the transformations set out in the European Green Deal

- Green Deal call: there are 20 topics open in 2020
- Deadline for submitting project proposals
 - **26 January 2021**

- Maximum duration: None — unless specified in the call
- Calls are evaluated on Excellence, Impact and Implementation
 - Each criterion scored from 0 to 5
- For proposals with the same score the [General Annexes](#) specify the process for prioritising equal proposals (differs by action)
- SSH/gender analysis “flag”

- **European capacities for citizen deliberation and participation for the Green Deal – SSH & gender flagged**
- RIA: €3-5 million – 2-3 projects expected to be funded
- Establish transnational networks of experts, researchers, practitioners and relevant civil society organisations specialised in deliberative democracy and civic participation across Europe
 - Share good practice, tools and resources and implement participatory and deliberation processes on priority issues
 - Establish connection across diverse participation and deliberation processes across regions and countries
- Include several deliberative processes implemented in several Member states or associated countries + online multilingual deliberative platform

- **Behavioural, social and cultural change for the Green Deal – SSH & gender flagged**
- RIA: €3-5 million – 2-3 projects expected to be funded

- Establish transnational and transdisciplinary networks of experts, researchers, practitioners and relevant civil society organisations on behavioural, social and cultural change
 - jointly analyse social practices and behavioural change processes, including enabling as well as inhibiting factors
 - share good practice, tools and resources
 - implement relevant experimentation on priority issues to deliver on the European Green Deal
- Behavioural change: historical, cultural, societal, economic, psychological, gender and intersectional perspectives & full impact

 - Scalable design of green, positive energy neighbourhoods well embedded in the spatial, economic, technical, environmental, regulatory and social context of the demonstration sites
 - Digital solutions to increase usability, ensuring optimal comfort for users and a healthier living environment
 - inclusive design, occupants interaction
 - non-energy benefits

- Resilient restoration: enable a shift of social and behavioural patterns, inclusive involvement of social and economic actors
- Upscaling and mainstreaming of ecosystem restoration → systemic transformation in governance, policy making, economic development, social innovation and regional strategic planning
- The project results should enhance empowerment, engagement and reconnection of local communities with nature and increase social awareness on restoration actions, and their benefits

 - Make sure you fulfil the eligibility criteria
 - Address all of the topic
- Impact is essential
- Don't neglect RRI approach
- Tailored dissemination and exploitation plan
- Make the proposal simple to read for the evaluators
- What is the EU added value?
- Build on other project results, explain synergies
