Societal Challenges: Consortia building in the final year of H2020

UK scientists, researchers and businesses can continue to participate in, bid for and lead projects in Horizon 2020, as if the UK remained a Member State, even after the UK exits the EU on 31st January 2020, and after the end of the transition period at end-2020. The UK remains the second highest recipient of Horizon 2020 funding for science and innovation and UK organisations are encouraged to continue to bid into calls for grants until the end of the Horizon 2020 programme.

In first section of the webinar, the SC6 NCP will signpost to existing materials aiming to highlight and discuss the UK’s continued participation in the final year of H2020. The second half of the webinar will be centred around an interactive discussion on consortia building between webinar participants to share their experiences.
